

Homeowner Care Volunteer Fact Sheet

Thank you for your interest in learning more about becoming a **Homeowner Care Volunteer** at **The Pittsburgh Project**. In our neighborhood, and in others around Pittsburgh, senior citizens, shut-ins and disabled residents are often at the most risk. For these neighbors, we seek opportunity to build relationships and to repair their failing homes. Each year, we serve the home repair needs of over 150 homeowners through crews of volunteers, most of whom are students. Many of these homeowners could benefit from ongoing relationships with volunteers who are interested in building friendships with them on a year-round basis.

What is the Vision and Purpose of The Pittsburgh Project?

Our **vision** statement reads “That Pittsburgh will be called a City of Truth, where once again, men and women of ripe old age will sit in the streets, each with cane in hand because of age, and where the city streets will be filled with boys and girls playing there.” (from Zechariah 8:4-5)

Our **purpose** statement reads, “We develop servant leaders and uphold the dignity of vulnerable homeowners.”

What does a Homeowner Care Volunteer do?

Homeowner Care Volunteers commit to visit one homeowner and to offer them a listening ear. These volunteers are simply asked to give the precious gift of time and compassion to someone truly in need of companionship and in turn to receive the friendship of someone precious in God’s sight.

What is the time commitment?

Homeowner Care Volunteers make a commitment to monthly visits for one year. They may of course renew this commitment after that period, if they so desire. They also provide our **Homeowner Care Coordinator** with regular reports on their visits.

Do I need to have special skills or training to volunteer in this ministry?

You just need a desire to care for vulnerable aging people within our community and a sincere respect for people of different backgrounds, races, faiths and cultural groups. You will also need to provide your own transportation for visitation or visit with another **Homeowner Care Volunteer** who has transportation.

What kind of training or orientation do I need?

New volunteers are required to attend one of our scheduled *Homeowner Care Orientations* that are typically held on Saturday mornings in the fall and spring semesters. Orientations are held at our site, 2801 North Charles Street, on the North Side of the city. Ginny Giles, Volunteer Resources Manager at The Pittsburgh Project, leads these sessions. **Individual orientations can also be scheduled as needed.**

During the orientation, participants will review a position description in specific detail and receive helpful information regarding their role as a volunteer. Completion of the orientation does not obligate someone to commit to this opportunity.

How will I be matched with a homeowner to visit?

Lauren Albert, Homeowner Services Manager will match volunteers with homeowners. Lauren and the rest of the Homeowner Services team get to know each of our homeowners when we provide their home repair needs and they can assess who would most benefit from ongoing relationships with volunteer visitors. Homeowners will also be asked whether or not they would like to be part of our visitation network and they will provide us with pertinent information if they decide to become involved.

When I have concerns or questions in my volunteer service, who will support me?

We desire that our volunteers will feel cared for as they reach out to care for others. **Homeowner Care Volunteers** will contact Lauren Albert at 412-321-1678 for most concerns or questions regarding their visits but Ginny Giles, Dave Herr and Ed Dixon will also be available should concerns arise.

What are the personal requirements for this ministry?

Interested persons should possess a Christian commitment and a desire to serve God. They must be 21 years or older. Patience, compassion and sincere care for the concerns of aging individuals are important personal traits as well. Eligible candidates must provide two references and complete applicable record checks.
